**Giorgi Kheladze**

**The Court,**

Having seen that the accused Giorgi Kheladze, holder of Georgian passport number 10BA59190.

Was charged for having on the 16<sup>th</sup> June 2011 at 5:00pm in the Maltese Islands:

1. Committed theft of a computer from a retail outlet styled as I Centre to the detriment of the owner/s, which theft is aggravated by value of the thing stolen which

exceeds two hundred and thirty-two Euros and ninety-four cents (€232.94), but which does not exceed the value of two thousand and three hundred and twenty-nine Euros and thirty-seven cents (€2329.40), breaching Article 261(c) and 267 of the Chapter Nine of the Laws of Malta;

2. And also charge him with having during the same period and circumstances in these Islands knowingly received or purchased any property which has been stolen, misapplied or obtained by means of any offence, whether committed in Malta or abroad, or knowingly took part, in any manner whatsoever, in the sale or disposal of the same in breach of Article 334 of the Chapter Nine of the Laws of Malta.

After seeing acts of proceedings;

After seeing the consent of the Attorney General;

After seeing Articles 261(c). 267 and 334 of the Criminal Code; and

After hearing examination of the accused whereby he pleaded guilty to the charge brought against him after the prosecution withdrew the second charge brought against him, and the confirmation by the accused of such plea when given the appropriate time to reconsider his position, and after having heard the declaration by the accused Giorgio Kheladze that he is going to repay the value of the money of the said computer, finds him guilty of the said charge and by virtue of Article 28A of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta condemns him to eight (8) months imprisonment suspended for two (2) years.

Finally, explained in simple words the repercussions if said order is not abided with.
