Informal Copy of Judgement

Having seen that the accused Mohamed Haji Abdilwahid Nur, holder of Maltese Identity Card Number 36750(A);

Was charged with having:

1. On the 14th December 2014 between 16:00hrs and 17:00hrs in Triq is-Salib tal-Marsa, Marsa with the intent to commit theft from a vehicle bearing registration number LCM 598 of make Volkswagen Bora to the detriment of Matthew Azzopardi and/or other person or persons, manifested such intent by overt acts which were followed by a commencement of the execution of a such crime, which crime was not completed in the consequence of some accidental cause independent of his will and if such theft was completed, it would have been qualified by the nature of the thing stolen an value which value is more than two hundred thirty-two Euros and ninety four cents (€232.94), but not more than two thousand three hundred and twenty-nine Euros and thirty-seven cents (€2329.37);
2. Also, on the 20th December 2014 between 17:30hrs and 19:00hrs in Triq is-Salib tal-Marsa, Marsa wilfully committed spoil, damage or injury to or upon any movable or immovable property that is damages to vehicle bearing registration number LCM 598 to the detriment of the owners which amount of damage does exceed two hundred and fifty Euros (€250);
3. Also, he is being charged of being a recidivist;
4. Also, he is being charged of breaking a suspended sentence which was definite and cannot be changed on the 22nd January 2013 by Magistrate Dr F Depasquale LL.D.
5. Also, he is being charged of breaking a suspended sentence, which sentence is definite and cannot be changed dated 15th March 2013 by Magistrate Dr M Hayman LL.D.

Seen all documentation; including the consent by the Attorney General so that the case will be dealt with summarily;

Seen Articles 41(a), 49, 56, 261(c)(g), 267, 271(g) and 325(b) of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta;

Since there was a guilty plea by the accused and the confirmation of such plea after being given the opportunity to reconsider his plea, the accused is being found guilty of the charges brought against him and condemns him to five (5) months imprisonment.
