Godwin Eze Benjamin

Today the 17th of March, 2015

The Court:

Having seen the accusations brought against the accused Godwin Eze Benjamin, holder of Nigerian Passport Number A 04565684.

Accused that:

1. On the 26th of December 2014 at about quarter past four in the afternoon (16:15hrs) in Paola and in the preceding time on these

Islands, he committed forgery of any authentic and public instrument or of any commercial document or private bank document, by counterfeiting or altering the writing or signature, by feigning any fictitious agreement, disposition, obligation or discharge, or by the insertion of any such agreement, disposition, obligation or discharge in any of the said instruments or documents after the formation thereof, or by any addition to or alteration of any clause, declaration or fact which such instruments or documents were intended to contain or prove;

2. At the same time, place, dates and circumstances, knowingly made use of any of the false acts, writing, instruments or documents mentioned in the preceding articles of this sub-title;
3. At the same time, place, dates and circumstances, committed any other kind of forgery, or shall knowingly make use of any other forged document, not provided for in the preceding articles of this Title;
4. Also on the 26th of December 2014 at about quarter past four in the afternoon (16:15hrs) in Paola and/or in the preceding time and dates in Paola and/or on these islands drove a motor vehicle make Peugeot 205 with registration number IAS 472 or other vehicle without a license or an unlicensed motor vehicle or other vehicle, or in a reckless, negligent or dangerous manner;
5. The Court is kindly indicated that in case of guilt, find the accused as a relapser in terms of 49 and 50 of the Criminal Code, Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta, by sentences given to Godwin Eze Benjamin, sentences that are definitive and cannot be changed.

The Court:

Read the documents;

Heard the evidence;

After having seen the Articles 183, 184 and 189 of Chapter 9 of the Laws of Malta and Article 15 of Chapter 65 of the Laws of Malta.

Considered:

The Court considers that the accused voluntarily and unconditionally admitted the charges brought against him by the prosecution, which left the Court with no alternative but to find the accused guilty as charged.

Therefore, the Court conditionally discharges the accused for a period of two (2) years in terms of Article 22 of Chapter 446 of the Laws of Malta.

The Court also orders the confiscation of the documents presented in Court.

The Court explained the consequences of the judgement to the accused.
